The Story of Wood Badge

In September of 1919, Baden-Powell, the founder of the Scouting movement, held the first Scoutmasters' training camp. Baden-Powell realized that for the movement to flourish, leaders must be trained to carry the ideals and methods of Scouting.

When they had finished training together, he gave each participant a simple wooden bead from the headdress of a South African Zulu chieftain. From these beads came the name Wood Badge.

The course was so successful that it has continued ever since and has spread throughout the world of Scouting. Although it has undergone changes to meet modern needs, the fundamental concepts and traditions introduced by Baden-Powell remains the cornerstone of the course. Wood Badge is the premier training program of Scouting.

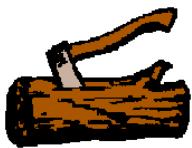

Wood Badge is not an award. It confers no special status or membership. Wearing the Wood Badge Beads simply means that a course attendee has completed the six day (two weekend) practical course and has applied the leadership skills in a post program assignment.

Attending Wood Badge will make your Scouting job easier. Attendees gain an in-depth understanding of the skills of leadership. The skills you learn will help you become a more effective Leader in Scouting, your career, your family, and your community life.

Who should attend Wood Badge? Scouters who are seeking to continue to improve their knowledge, skills, and ability to lead scouts and other adults to accomplish common goals.

EXPECTATIONS

You will have the opportunity to join with other Scouters to share ideas, discuss challenges and locate resources. Attendees form new and lasting friendships during their Wood Badge experience, as the spirit of scouting spreads. For six days you will learn and apply the principles of leadership using the aims and methods of Scouting. You will live and work in the outdoors with fellow Scouters under the guidance of the Wood Badge staff.



OUTCOMES

As the six day practical portion of the program draws to a close you will set some personal goals to practice your new knowledge and skills. In meeting your goals, you will strengthen both yourself and Scouting. You will have 18 months to reach these goals. By practicing your new knowledge and skills you will become a more effective leader. In addition to your own personal growth, the scouts you serve will benefit most from your developmental commitment.
